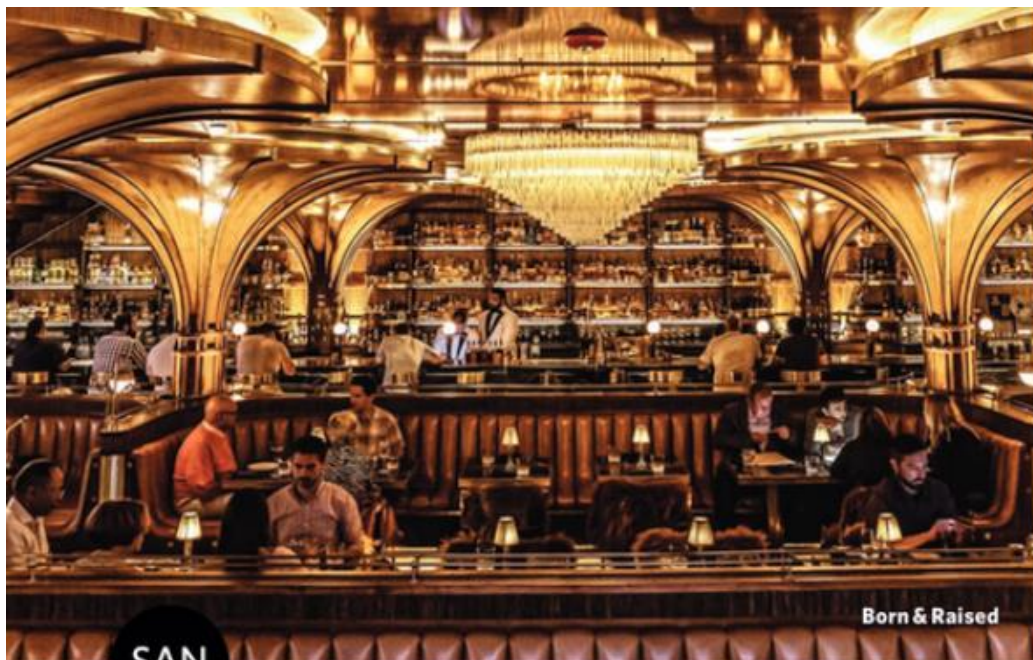

In the city's Little Italy neighborhood—the largest such area in the U.S.—food and culture have deep roots.

Why Now: Once a fishing community of more than 6,000 Italian families, Little Italy experienced a rough patch in the 1980s when the tuna industry declined. Thanks to revitalization efforts, however, the area is booming once again and is one of the city's hottest hoods for living, eating and shopping.

Where to Go: Wake up

at the new Carté Hotel, which gets high marks for its ocean-design vibes, heated saltwater pool and expansive rooftop bar. For breakfast, add your name to the list at the visually arresting Morning Glory—it's built its reputation on items like soufflé pancakes and Millennial Tears (aka avocado toast)—and visit the nearby shops while you wait. Vocabulary

specializes in chic women's clothing and accessories, many from local designers; urban surf shop Atacama will prep you to tackle the waves. Later, take a break at the Piazza della Famiglia, where you can duck into the Little Italy Food Hall. Don't leave without visiting Bobboi Natural Gelato, which has won fans with scoops such

as pistachio, charcoal vanilla, salted caramel and pluot. Art lovers will want to make time to view the Richard Serra installations at the Museum of Contemporary Art San Diego, while those in need of a libation should hit up the city's oldest pub, The Waterfront Bar & Grill. Little Italy's dining scene is on fire, so make sure to reserve before heading to popular eateries such as Italian restaurant Civico 1845, steakhouse Born & Raised or restaurateur Brian Malarkey's much-lauded Herb & Wood. — **JENNIFER**
