

19 Exciting Hotels Opening In Europe in 2019

From the streets of London to the shores of the Mediterranean, and the runways of Milan to Copenhagen's canals, gorgeous new hotels are set to debut across Europe in 2019. Travelers looking for everything from a sophisticated city escape to a balmy beach getaway will have the benefit of new luxury hotels and resorts galore to count on in the coming year. Here are some of the most exciting hotels that will open their doors in Europe in 2019.

The First Roma Dolce Hotel: February 2019

A sister property to the First Roma Arte, the Eternal City's newest member of Preferred Hotels makes its home in a 19th-century building designed by Italian architect Giuseppe Valadier, whose most famous work of urban planning was the Piazza del Popolo. The hotel has just 23 guestrooms and suites, each a little cocoon of design-driven comfort with amenities like Italian-marble bathrooms, state-of-the-art technology and in-room fitness areas and equipment. The hotel will also have an onsite restaurant called the Patisserie.



Mystery Hotel, Budapest: February 2019

Another new Preferred Hotels affiliate, this 82-room Hungarian hideaway will be located in a 19th-century Freemason building in the city's central 6th district, and capitalizes upon that mystical heritage with elements like decorative optical illusions and visual references. Guestrooms are bright and garden-like, inspired by Greek architecture. The hotel's palatial fine-dining restaurant, The Great Hall, will be located on the fourth floor, while guests can also take advantage of a rooftop garden where cocktails and snacks will be served, and relaxing treatments in the Secret Garden Spa.

Amerikalinjen, Oslo: March 2019

Norway's capital lags behind its Nordic peers when it comes to cool boutique hotels, but it will certainly start catching up after the opening of this Preferred Hotels property in March. The Amerikalinjen will take over the former headquarters of the Norwegian America Line, which was originally built in 1919. The new hotel will have 122 rooms and suites, all with high ceilings and Art Deco touches that hearken to the golden age of ship travel. Guests can unwind in the Pier 42 cocktail bar or the Gustav jazz club after a day out in the city, or enjoy a meal in the Atlas Brasserie & Café before a performance at the opera house just around the corner.
