

The Preferred Legacy

It's been exactly 50 years since the Preferred Hotels & Resorts launch in the United States. We interview CEO Lindsey Ueberroth about its illustrious portfolio.

t was 1968; 12 independent hoteliers in America had joined hands to launch Preferred Hotels & Resorts. a brand that would market 12 huxury hotels in the USA. The company grew substantially in the 90s, and by the time they hit the millennium, they had acquired several prominent. international properties in their portfolio, including The Ritz, Paris, Then, in 2004. John Ueberroth, then CEO and Co-Chairman of Ambassadors International, Inc (a travel and cruise company), bought Preferred, and the rest, as

they say, is history. A few years back, John's daughter, Lindsey Ueberroth took over as CEO. An ambitious businesswoman and leader, she opened up about her emotional attachment to the brand.

"To step into his shoes... I can't explain the emotion that goes into that," says Lindsey, of her father's decision to make her the CEO in 2014. She admits that as a new leader, "It was hard not to bite off more than I could chew. When my father bought the company, we had 300 independent hotels; now we're at 700 hotels, resorts.

and residences and in over 85 countries." The pressure was intense, but she attributes the success to her parents who've always been passionate about travel. Since her joining, Lindsey has had her own share of landmark moments in the company. I PREFER, the Preferred loyalty programme, was her brainchild and she is ecstatic that it's doing well, "But, you had to first convince 650 hotels that this was a good idea." Besides establishing I PREFER, she also launched Preferred Boutique in 2005. This brand was retired in 2015 when the company was

rebranded, following which, all hotels were aligned into five distinct collections. Does she have any favourites? "Oh gosh. all of them are so good!" She gives in eventually, choosing one hotel from each group. "I love the Oiai Valley Inn & Spa in California from the LEGEND Collection, The Hari Hotel London from LIFESTYLE. The Pendry San Diego from LVX. MonHôtel Lounge & Spa, Paris from the CONNECT collection. and the Montage Beverly Hills, California from Preferred Residences."

SNOW-CAPPED TREASURES OF TITLIS

At the summit of Switzerland's most well-known glacier, Mount Titlis, there is only one season—winter. The year-round icy wonderland, located 3,020 metres above sea level, not only offers panoramic views of surrounding mountains and valleys, but is also the destination to enjoy a variety of outdoor activities, including skiing, snowtubing, abseiling, and even descending into the frosty heart of the glacier itself!

TITLIS CLIFF WALK

Take a leap of faith as you step on to this narrow bridge, suspended 3.041 metres above sea level and 500 metres off the ground—the highest of its kind in Europe. Stretching just 100-metres long, from the summit to the Ice Flyer chair-lift station, the

adrenalin-pumping, 150-steps walk is not for the faint hearted. The views into the abyss below, however, makes the journey worthwhile.

This invigorating trip through the air involves travelling in an open chair

lift, with nothing but a harness to hold you in place as you glide over the 20-metres deep crevasses below. In the summer, the Ice Flyer operates from the mountain station to the Titlis glacier park, while in winters, the ride takes you all the way up to the fantastic ski slopes on the summit.

Whether you prefer snowboarding, toboggining, or sliding down the slopes on a minibob, the glacier park guarantees action-packed fun through the day. Kids are sure to love snowtubing, as they can skim down the glistening snow track on a rubber tyre.
